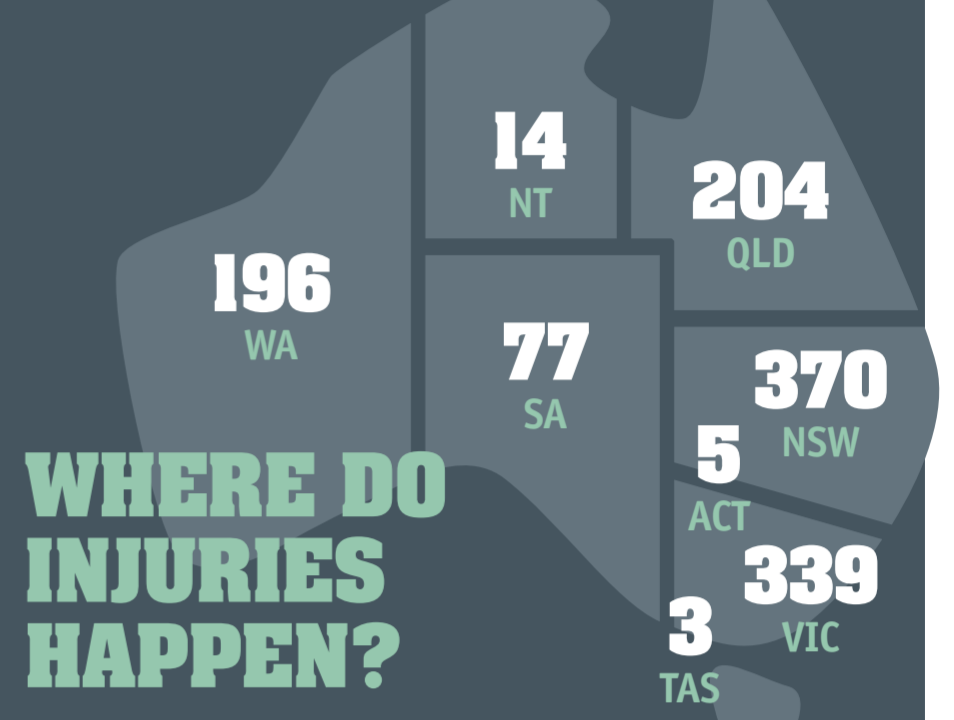


PARTS OF THE BODY MOST FREQUENTLY INJURED

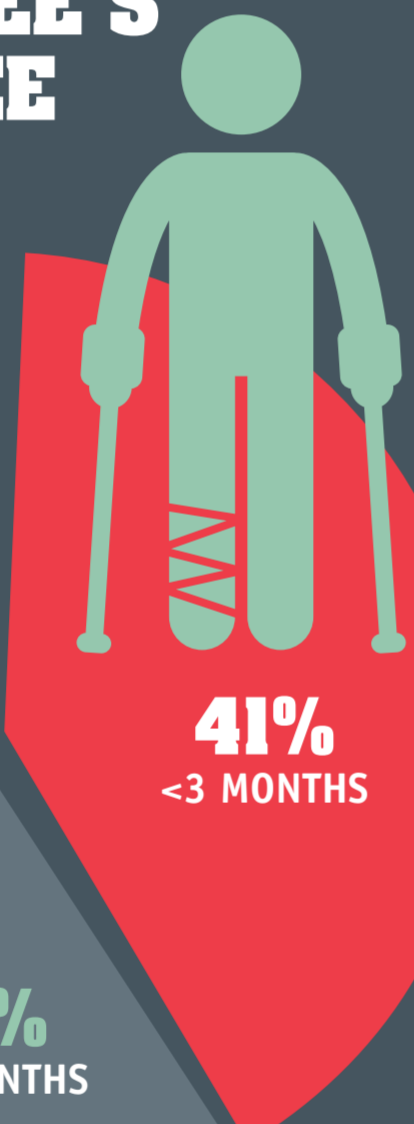
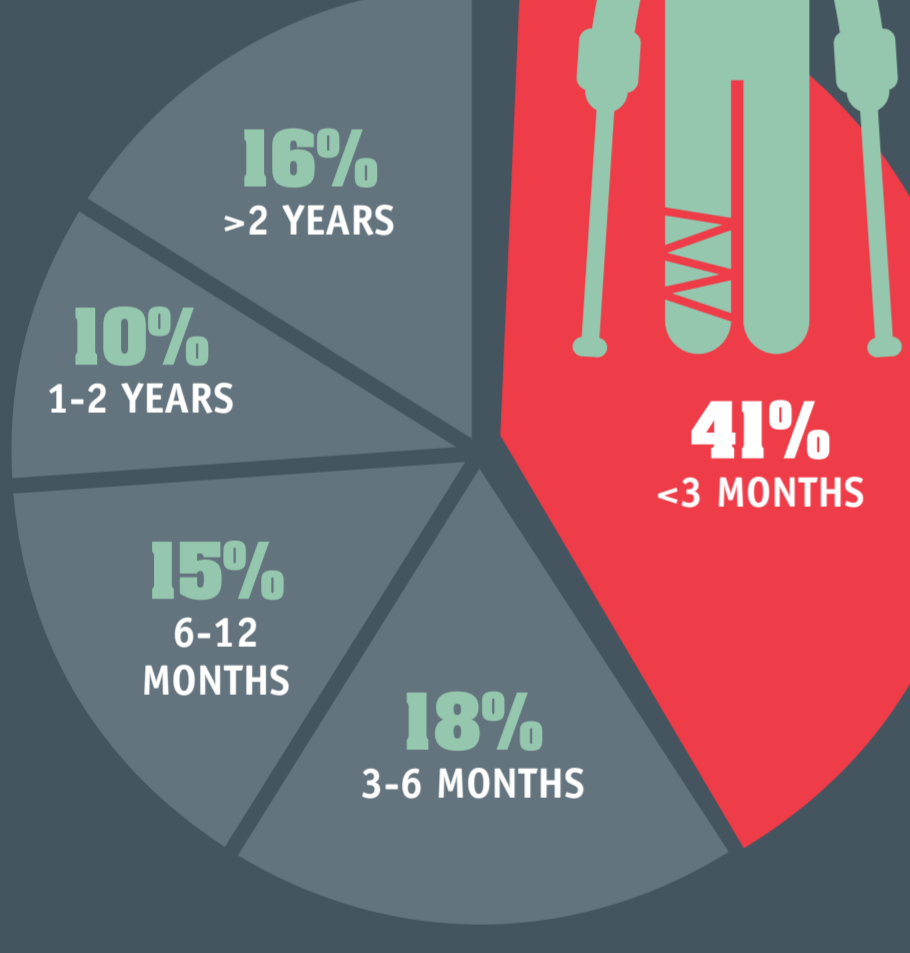

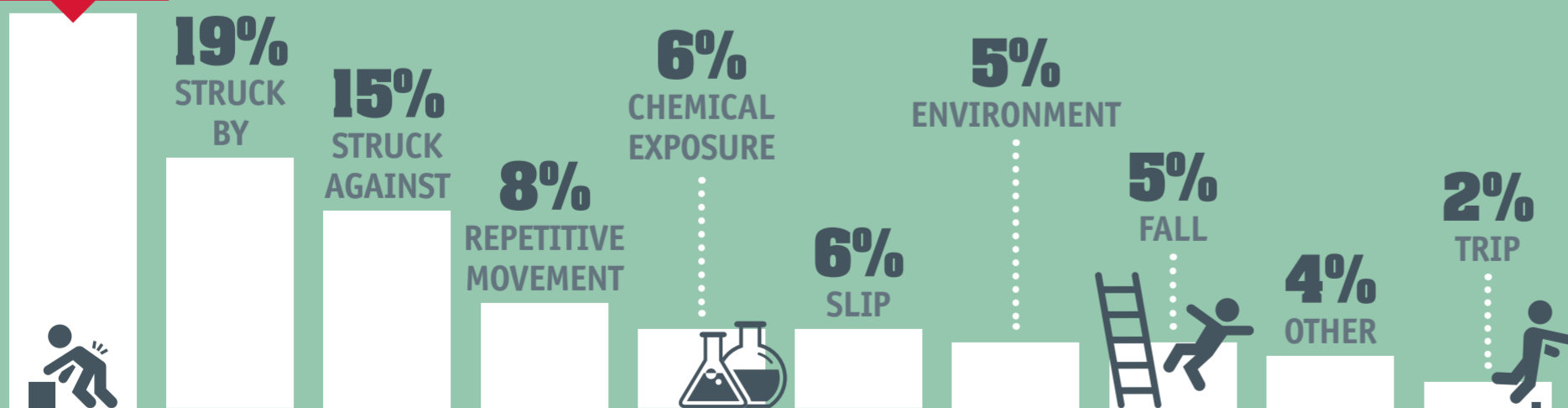
